**Driving Ease of Doing Business** 

Reinforcing the Administration's commitment to enhancing the ease of doing business, Shri Vijay Kumar, Chairman Inland Waterways Authority of India and the designated Task Force Member for A&N Islands, visited Sri Vijaya Puram on March 22nd, 2025.

He was accompanied by a high-level team of 06 officers representing key government bodies, including the Cabinet Secretariat, DPIIT, MSME, and NITI Aayog, highlighting the national importance placed on this initiative.

Constituted on January 24, 2025, under the chairpersonship of the Cabinet Secretary, the Task Force on Compliance Reduction and Deregulation was formed to identify and address regulatory burdens hindering economic activity. It had identified 23 Priority Areas spanning critical sectors such as Land Use, Building & Construction, Labour, Overarching Priorities, and Utilities & Permissions, and shared these in a dedicated docket for A&N.

During their visit, the Task Force Member and his team engaged in crucial discussions with line departments and stakeholders from the A&N Islands. The focus was intently on reviewing these identified Priority Areas and collaboratively charting the way forward for effective Compliance Reduction and Deregulation. aiming to create a more investor-friendly and efficient business climate.

This dynamic event served as a crucial platform for aspiring entrepreneurs, students, and youths from across the Islands to showcase their creativity and problem-solving skills. College of Engineering, ITI, DBRAIT, and Pondicherry University Andaman Campus, as well as local entrepreneurs and youths, attended.

A diverse portfolio of short-term training programs was delivered across the Islands, covering traditional crafts like handicrafts, value-added processes in food production, and essential livelihood skills such as poultry/dairy farming.

These initiatives reached hundreds of participants, complementing the ongoing year-long conventional industrial training programs which continue to equip 242 candidates with foundational skills in various trades, preparing them for employment and entrepreneurship.
